Conservation Committee seeks public comment

The State Conservation Committee (SCC) is seeking public comment on two proposed legislative rules stemming from the passage of Senate Bill 264 during the 2022 legislative session.

The 30-day comment period on 63-CSR-1, and 63-CSR-4 begins Monday, May 16, and concludes on Thursday, June 16, at 4 p.m. As part of the comment period, the agency will hold public hearings on both proposals on Thursday, May 19, at the Natural Resources Conservation Service's conference room, 1550 Earl L. Core Road, Morgantown, WV.

A hearing for 63-CSR-1 will begin at 11 a.m. The hearing on 63-CSR-4 will begin at 1 p.m. Participants may appear in person

Proposed rule 63-CSR-1 amends an existing rule and incorporates changes relating to the election of West Virginia's 114 conservation district supervisors. The rule details candidacy qualifications and procedures districts must follow when there are no candidates filing for the office, or when a vacancy occurs. The proposal also makes minor modifications to the process for spending watershed improvement funds.

The proposed rule 63-CSR-4 is a new rule relating to accounting and auditing procedures West Virginia's 14 conservation districts must follow.

Manchin introduces bipartisan bill to establish **Space National Guard**

U.S. Senator Joe Manchin (D-WV), member of the Senate Armed Services Committee (SASC), introduced the bipartisan Space National Guard Establishment Act to create a National Guard for the U.S. Space Force. The legislation would allow Army and Air National Guard currently performing Space Force support missions to continue to serve their states and country through a Space National Guard. Companion legislation was introduced in the House of Representatives last year.

"West Virginia has a rich history of contributing to achievements in space, from the important work of 'Hidden Figures' Katherine Johnson and 'Rocket Boys' Homer Hickam to the many West Virginians working at NASA and serving in the Space Force today," said Senator Manchin. "We are grateful for the men and women serving in space-based missions for their sacrifices and dedication that keep all Americans safe. I am proud to lead this bipartisan bill to create a Space National Guard to ensure National Guard personnel in West Virginia and across the country can continue their service within a reserve component organization that represents their specialized space-based missions."

In 2019, active-duty space units were moved out of the Air Force and placed in the new Space Force, but no corresponding move was made to create a Space National Guard. There are currently more than 1,000 National Guard members serving the space mission from within the Air National Guard. The Space National Guard Establishment Act would correct this disconnect and ensure that Space Force personnel who leave active-duty can continue to serve within the Space Force. Additionally, the legislation would eliminate funding obstacles between the Air Force and Space Force, facilitate mobilization and inspection processes and enhance the culture of the Space Force.

Voting turnout low for primary election

Voting turnout in last week's primary balloting was disappointingly low. Only 1,771 ballots were cast -1,107 on the Republican side, 633 on the Democratic side, and 31 non-partisan, along with four blank ballots out of a total of 8,622 registered voters, an overall percentage of 20.54%.

A larger proportion of Republican with 15 voters than Democrats cast ballots -33.67% and 22.23% respectively.

In the contest for U. S. House of a total of 1,069 votes cast, Alexander X. Mooney led the field comfortably with 806 votes, followed by David E. McKinley with 187, Susan Buchser-Lochocki with 43, Mike Seckman with 18, and Rhonda A. Hercules

In the Republican contests, the House of Delegates position. race for State Senate, 14th District recorded a total of 1,065 votes. In Representatives, 2nd District, out of the lead was William J. R. Keplinger, who garnered 536 of them, followed by Stephen Garth Smith with 358, Jay Taylor with 91, Angela M. Iman with 61, and James Lough with 19. Running unopposed, incumbent

Bryan C. Ward received 881 votes,

Culturally, we're quick to use words like "heroes" and "thanks for your service" with those who, well, serve. They're nice gestures, and most appreciate them for what they are.

You know what would really help?

When you're driving, put down your cell phones and pay attention. Watch for pedestrians, bicyclists, motorcycles, and other drivers. Do not mix drugs and alcohol with driving. Check your rear and side view mirrors, instead of your text messages.

Listen for sirens. Watch for fast-moving emergency vehicles trying to get around you.

And get out of the way: It could be your loved one they're trying to save.

The sirens and horns that drive you nuts, sound like hope to someone else.

Don't complain about the ambulance fee in Hardy County: Pay it. Just because you've never needed an ambulance, doesn't mean you or someone you love won't need one and the equipment on it later today.

Emergencies are just that. They happen in an instant, a heartbeat, and often the worst possible time. No one wakes up and thinks, "Today is a good day to have a massive heart attack..." Or break a leg. Or any of the other myriad things that happen to make people call 911.

May is also the official beginning of Trauma Season; it's when summer 'begins,' along with vacations, longer days, active wildlife, water sports, camping, grilling, and general merriment mixed with major doses of some of those people getting really sick and really hurt.

Be careful. People love you. And while most people in EMS can't deny weird senses of humor, appreciating air horns and big engines, and the thrill of diagnosing and treating patients... A day that goes quickly for EMS, is a day that's gone pretty badly for those who needed them.

EMS are the people who show up at the worst moments of your worst days, to try to help.

They'll crawl in your wrecked car with you. They'll hike through the woods to get to you. They'll hold your hand, figuratively and literally, when you cry from fear or pain. Nothing matters but the patient.

They love serving their communities. They'd prefer not to be needed.

event of the day would be an appointment with the neurologist who guides my treatment for Parkinson's Disease at Veterans Administration Medical Center (VAMC) in Martinsburg, West Virginia. Mother was doing her job licking, but calf wasn't responding. Big white faced black calf was lying out flat, head on the ground. Head raised or attempting to stand up would have

Thursday, May 12, 2022. Big been normal. My choice between care for calf and mother, or making my appointment with my doctor fell on the side of Martinsburg and I'd check on calf soon as I got back.

> Usual routine of COVID masks and symptom questions allowed me into the crowded parking lot in a section with a long walk to hospital front revolving door which didn't exist anymore. In fact the entire glassed-in front lobby was missing and the major hole it left was covered with plywood. Several folks, either employees or patients and signs were guiding newcomers to an alternate business entrance.

It turned out "some woman" driving past hospital's front entrance in a Volkswagon had turned hard right and driven her car through the revolving door and glassed front, through the front lobby past the information desk elevators. Conjecture was rampant. Was she a medical emergency herself, around and driven it back out. a highly perturbed patient, an activist, a terrorist? Nobody had an answer.



Bill to improve public land mapping and boost recreation

U.S. Senator Joe Manchin (D-WV), Chairman of the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee, joined U.S. Senators John Barrasso (R-WY), Ranking Member of the Committee, Angus King (I-ME) and James Risch (R-ID) in applauding the enactment of their bipartisan Modernizing Access to our Public Land (MAPLand) Act.

The MAPLand Act will digitize and standardize mapping records, like access points and permissible uses on federal public lands, to boost outdoor recreation and improve hunting and fishing access for sportsmen and women.

Potomac Edison's 2022 Tree-Trimming Program Underway

Potomac Edison, a subsidiary of to inspect and maintain lines and make part of a \$4.6 million program. FirstEnergy Corp. (NYSE: FE), has kicked off its 2022 tree-trimming program with plans to clear vegetation along approximately 3,100 miles of power lines in Maryland and the Eastern Panhandle of West Virginia to help enhance electric service reliability for customers.

Maintaining proper clearances and removing dead or diseased trees around electrical equipment can help reduce the frequency and duration of power outages, especially those associated with severe weather. repairs quicker if an outage occurs.

"Vegetation management is crucial to our service reliability efforts and one of the most effective ways we can reduce the impact of treerelated outages for customers," said Linda Moss, president of FirstEnergy's Maryland operations.

As part of Potomac Edison's \$33 million program, trees are inspected and pruned in a manner that helps preserve the health of the tree while maintaining safe clearances near electrical equipment. In some cases, trees that present a danger or are diseased may be removed. Similar work will be performed along 242 miles of the company's high-voltage

Potomac Edison will be conducting tree-trimming work in the following towns in Hardy County this year: and communities this year: Baker, Perry, and Wardensville.

The vegetation management work is conducted by certified tree experts under the company's direction, including Asplundh Tree Expert Company, Lewis Tree, N.G. Gilbert, Nelson Tree Service, Wright Tree Service and Xylem Tree Experts.

The State Treasurer's Office returned a total of \$2,548,059 worth of unclaimed property during April.

claims paid out during the month announced his Office returned more an increase of 45 percent over the Office recently placed video ads for 1,744 claims paid during March.

Treasurer Moore said it's not surprising to see a jump in claims as people cope with rising inflation costs.



McCausley Case

Carter Williams from Special Prosecutor John Ours, in which Ours concluded there was "no credible evidence" of criminal activity on the part of Deputy McCausley. In August 2021, Ours told the Examiner that the investigation was closed, a position he recanted a month ago in another conversation with the Examiner. He explained that an additional issue requiring further investigation came to light after he made the previous statement.

In a third call with the Examiner last week, Ours conceded that the criminal investigation remained open. Asked if the State Police had issued a further report since the prelim-

inary report last August, he said they had not, and that the basis for his own report was only a telephone conver-

sation with State Police investigators. A second criminal investigation into an alleged death threat made by McCausley began in February, when a Hardy County citizen furnished the Sheriff's Department and State Police with a recording of a conversation in which McCausley can be heard saying: "...it's took(sic) everything I had in a year and two months – almost three months – not to put a bullet between somebody else's f---ing eyes..."

That investigation also remains open. Last week, the Examiner reported Special Prosecutor Ours claimed no knowledge of the second investigation. While the reporting was accurate, in a follow-up conversation last Friday, Ours explained why he was unaware of its existence: He was not appointed Special Prosecutor in that investigation. He explained the procedure to be followed in matters requiring the appointment of a Special Prosecutor: The matter is brought first to the County Prosecutor – in this case Hardy County Prosecutor Lucas See – who must refer any matter that could cause local authorities to have a conflict of interest or present the appearance of impropriety to the Prosecutors' Institute in Charleston, which then selects someone outside the ju-

risdiction and therefore presumed impartial as Special Prosecutor. The selection is made as a recommendation to a Judge in the jurisdiction, who then signs the order appointing

that individual as Special Prosecutor. Apparently, the Hardy County Prosecutor's Office has made no such referral in the alleged death threat investigation. See was not in the office when the Examiner reached out for comment on Friday. The inquiry was initially referred to one of the Assistant Prosecutors. The Assistant Prosecutor was apparently also in a meeting and unavailable at that time. A follow-up call shortly before press time on Monday deter-

mined that the Assistant Prosecutor would be on vacation this week, and the receptionist was uncertain if See would be coming into the office this week. The second Assistant Prosecutor was also unavailable for comment

as of press time. McCausley's reinstatement to active status has caused concern and alarm for people in the community. Maher, presumably the object of the recorded threat, told the Examiner he takes the threat very seriously, and fears for the safety of himself and his family. Other people, speaking on condition of anonymity for fear of retaliation from McCausley or Dawson, have heard McCausley say he will be "gunning for" individuals who have spoken out against him, once he returns to duty. All cautioned that Examiner staff should expect retaliation from McCausley and Dawson.

Dawson termed the possibility of such retaliation "ridiculous" and told the reporter not to call him for further comment, promising he would call the Examiner when there was "anything newsworthy to report."

McCausley is scheduled for daytime shifts Saturday through Tuesday.

Election Totals

Committee, 14th District Male recorded a total of 1,378 votes cast, with Stephen Garth-Smith receiving 687, followed by Jay Taylor with 275, Dave Sypolt with 253, and Bruce Kolson with 160. Three writein votes were also cast.

Only four votes were cast for Circuit Clerk, and all were write-ins, since no candidate had filed to run for the office.

A total of 719 votes were cast for County Clerk, 711 of them going to Trevor Southerly, with an additional eight write-ins.

The contest for Congressional District Executive Committee, District 2 Female had no candidates who had filed, and so only a single writein vote was cast.

The Congressional District Executive Committee, District 2 Male position, which also had no candidates who had filed, fared only slightly better, with a total of three write-in votes cast.

The Senatorial Executive Committee, District 14 Female contest

also had no candidates filed, and only garnered a single write-in vote. The male side contest, also with no filed candidates, did slightly better, with two write-in votes cast.

The Delegate District Executive Committee, District 86 Female contest had no candidates and not even any write-ins, while its corresponding contest on the male side recorded a single write-in vote.

In the contest for County Executive Committee Capon, the female side far outpaced most of the others with Sherri Hof receiving a total of 160 votes. The male counterpart position had no filed candidates and not a single ballot was cast in the race.

The female side fared equally well in the County Executive Committee Lost River contest, as candidate Heather Lee Mills captured all of the the State Senator, 14th District con-232 votes cast, while the counterpart male contest had no filed candidates and recorded only a single write-in

In Moorefield, however, the reverse was the case, as Joseph Roy Dodd received the total of the 85 votes cast, while on the female side, with no filed candidates, there was not even a single write-in.

The County Executive Committee contest in Old Fields post almost identical results on both the male and female sides. Stephen Garth Smith received 142 of the 145 votes cast, with three write-ins, while Breanna Malcolm also received 142 votes.

The South Fork District contest saw Joyce Schetrom receiving all but one of the 203 votes cast, while there was only a single write-in. Its male counterpart contest recorded all 166 votes cast for Rob Class.

On the Democratic side, in the U. S. House of Representatives, 2nd District contest, Angela J. Dwyer captured 357 of the 498 votes cast, besting Barry Lee Wendell, who re-

Running unopposed, Amanda Jo Pitzer received all 405 votes cast in

The House of Delegates, 86th District had 563 ballots cast, 294 of those for Jameson Paul Freeman, while Bradley "BJ" Rinard trailed with 269 votes.

The State Executive Committee, 14th District Female contest had 759 total votes cast, 397 for Deanna B. Armentrout, 256 for Candi Sisler, and 115 for Rita McCrobie.

For the contest for State Executive Committee, 14th District Male, the total count of 771 was divided among five filed candidates, with Jason A. Armentrout capturing 353 votes, followed by Michael McClintock with 129, Dale McCray with 115, Mike Manypenny with 110, and Randy Tichnell with 63. A single write-in completed the total.

Kelly J. Shockey received all but a single vote, which was a write-in, as the Democratic candidate for Circuit Clerk, receiving 572 of 573 cast.

There was no Democratic candidate filed for County Commissioner, so the contest only recorded 15 votes, all of them write-ins.

In the County Clerk contest, incumbent Gregory Ely received all of the 593 ballots cast.

There were no Democratic candidates filed on either the male or female side of the contest for District 2 Executive Committee, so the only votes cast were for write-ins, three in the female contest and two in the

Likewise the Democratic races for Executive Committee in District 14 had no candidates filed, but re-

corded four write-ins on the female side and two write-ins on the male

The District 86 Executive Committee contests, both male and female, also had no filed candidates, but recorded two and three write-in votes, respectively.

The Capon contest for County Executive Committee had no filed candidates for either the male or female positions, and no votes were cast in either race. The Lost River positions also had no filed candidates for either position, but did post a single write-in vote on the female side and three write-ins on the male side. The Moorefield counterparts also had no filed candidates, and recorded only a single write-in vote each in the male and female contests. The Old Fields contests had no filed candidates for either contest and no ballots cast in either race. The South Fork contests similarly had no field candidates and

She began physical therapy at Valley Health's Riverton Commons location with realistic expectations. "I'm not a patient person, but I have a wonderful physical therapist I absolutely adore," she said.

Dr. Lingamfelter, as well as Dr. Shibeshi, is fellowship-trained and experienced in all levels of orthopedic surgery complexity. "Robotic-assisted surgery is the next evolution in total joint replacement and delivers a level of accuracy which is beyond the human eye," said Dr. Lingamfelter. "Using this technology, we are able to plan and create a 3-dimensional model of the knee before the bone is

cut, which allows us to predict how the knee will respond to these implants. This delivers a more consistent and reproducible feel to every knee and allows us to achieve this goal using the most conservative bony cuts."

One of Dr. Lingamfelter's patients, Trista Runion, 47, of Martinsburg, had sustained multiple gymnastics injuries and previously struggled to hike and climb stadium steps at sporting events. "My knees are so bad I can't do a lot of things. It's especially hard to address being overweight when exercise is so painful," she said. "Dr. Lingamfelter was very compassionate; he didn't judge, he just wanted to help." Runion has had very little surgical pain since her robotic procedure in March and has made tremendous functional gains throughout her postoperative recovery. "I've never felt this stable," she said, adding that Dr. Lingamfelter's robot-assisted team will replace her other knee in mid-May.





Yellow Jackets oust East Hardy

The defense made the catches as the pitchers battled in a duel, limiting action on the base path with the Yellow Jackets scraping enough hits to rally for a 3-1 win ousting East Hardy in the Class A Region II Section 2 Baseball playoff elimination game on Saturday afternoon at George Hott Field. The three-time defending state champion Moorefield squad dug deep to survive and advance in returning to the section championship round with a battle against Petersburg starting Monday with two more victories needed to reach regional play. "Weese is a gamer. He wanted the ball. When I told him he was pitching, I thought he was going to hug me. He was excited to be pitching in a big game and he threw strikes all game. He mixed it up and our defense played well." Moorefield assistant coach Scott Stutler noted. "We have to hit better than we did today to do anything. We're not swinging very good during the game, but we got a couple of key hits when we needed them. We know what it is going to be in the championship. We know what it was like last time and we will have to get the hits to win the game.' The top of the first inning went by quickly in just ten pitches as Moorefield pitcher Gabe Weese managed to get each Cougars batter to fly out as Noah Sager sent a fly ball to right fielder Adam Landes, Brandon Jones launched the ball to

There was a scary moment as Moorefield's Bryce Hines had a ball ricochet off his bat and slam into his nose causing a stream of blood, but he would later return to action after receiving medical attention from athletic trainer Taylor Zuber. Moorefield senior Matthew Delawder took care of clearing up the blood in the batter's box with a shovel. Hines had a 2-2 count when leaving with the injury and pinch hitter Chase Myers came in and struck out looking. Teets started the second inning for the Cougars with a fly ball caught by Landes in right field. East Hardy's Nate Smith singled into center field for the game's first hit, but would be stranded as Levi Mongold popped out in foul territory to Moorefield third baseman Coleman Mongold and A.J. Swisher grounded out to Mongold. Moorefield's turn at the plate started with Alex Miller grounding out to

Moorefield's Branson See garnered a single into center field to match the hitting contest.

Tyson Arnold flew out to East Hardy center fielder Gabe Henderson near the fence, then Landes hit into a fielder's choice corralled by shortstop Dawson Price as the game remained scoreless with another baserunner on the pond.

"We just didn't get hits, timely hits like we needed to and we left a couple on base. They did a pretty good job of getting runners on first and second and bringing them in," East Hardy coach Tyler Mongold stated.

"That was the difference in the ball game and we didn't. They were hyped up, but we just didn't a pop-up caught by first execute as much as I baseman Levi Mongold, wanted them to today.

We have a young team and it is a good group coming up. We should be set for the next couple of years. We kept popping the ball up instead of line driving it. That was the difference, pop-up, pop-up, popup.'

East Hardy's Gabe Henderson launched the ball to left fielder Karson Reed for the second out. East Hardy's Noah Sager smashed a double down the right field line and Brandon Jones hit a sharp grounder to shortstop Tyson Arnold and beat the throw for a single for a scoring opportunity. The Yellow Jackets denied a run as Mongold made a stop on his knees on a grounder by Price and collected the ball in time for the groundout throw to first baseman Ryan McGregor to end the side.

McGregor drew a fullcount walk for the Yellow Jackets in the bottom of the frame, then advanced on a sacrifice bunt by Gavin Wolfe. Reed was hit by a pitch,

then Coleman Mongold hit into a fielder's choice out at second base and avoided the double play before the runners were left aboard the pond on a pop-up by Hines to Levi Mongold. East Hardy's J.W. Teets commenced the fourth inning with a single into right center field, then Smith executed a sacrifice bunt to create advancement as the ball was fielded by catcher Alex Miller. Levi Mongold grounded out to Weese, but that provided time to advance Teets to third base

East Hardy's A.J. Swisher delivered an RBI single down the left field line for a 1-nil edge, then remained on base as Logan Sager

popped out to Miller. Miller reached base on an error as the ball took a wicked hop underneath the glove of first baseman Levi Mongold.

Wolfe made a diving catch in the outfield to haul in a fly ball from Price to kick off the sixth inning, then Teets grounded out. Smith reached base on an error for the Cougars and was left on the pond as Levi Mongold flew out to Wolfe. The Yellow Jackets went down in order as Arnold flew out to left field, Garrett Strickler struck out looking and McGregor hit a laser to Levi Mongold at first

The Cougars were put down in the seventh inning with Weese still on the mound for a complete game as Swisher smacked a line drive to second baseman Coleman Mongold, then Logan Sager flew out to right field and Henderson struck out on a dropped third strike with Miller making the throw to McGregor for the final out of the playoff elimination game. Moorefield (13-14) advanced to play Petersburg in the section championship as East Hardy's season came to a finish with a record of 9-18.
